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
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Hotel Information & Location

AIRUM's 2013 conference has moved!

The 2013 AIRUM conference will be held at the Hilton Minneapolis-St. Paul Airport/Mall of America (3800 American Blvd E, Bloomington, Minnesota, 55425, USA). Located in lovely Bloomington, the hotel is next to the Minnesota Valley National

Wildlife Refuge featuring a complete Visitor Center and over 8 miles of walking/jogging trails through the beautiful MN River Valley. The hotel is one mile from the Mall of America and three miles from the Minneapolis St. Paul International airports; both of which are accessible via light rail just blocks from the hotel. Conference room rates are \$129 per night. The new location provides AIRUM with high quality technology, larger meeting rooms, and space to grow. See you there in November!



Pre-Conference Workshop and Plenary Speaker:

Dr. Stephen DesJardins



Dr. Des Jardins teaches courses related to public policy in higher education, economics and finances in postsecondary education, statistical methods, and institutional research and policy analysis. His research interests include student transitions from high school to college, what happens to students once they enroll in college, the economics of postsecondary education, and applying new statistical techniques to the study of these issues. His research has been published widely in education and economics journals. He is also on the editorial board of *Economics of Education Review*, is a contributing editor to *Research in Higher Education*, and is the methodology section editor for *Higher Education: Handbook of Theory and Research*.

Des Jardins received a BS in economics from Northern Michigan University, an MA in policy analysis and labor economics from the Hubert H. Humphrey Institute of Public Affairs at the University of Minnesota, and a PhD in higher education with a concentration in research and evaluation methods, also from the University of Minnesota. Prior to joining academia, he worked in market research in the private sector and was a policy analyst and institutional researcher for 13 years at the University of Minnesota.

Workshop: "Applying Quasi-Experimental Methods in IR".

In the morning participants will learn about quasi-experimental methods that are now so popular in the social sciences and increasingly used by education researchers. After establishing a clear understanding of the underlying concepts, we will interrogate some recent applications of these methods to postsecondary-related issues. Reading materials to be discussed will be provided prior to the workshop.

In the afternoon participants will learn how to apply some of the quasi-experimental techniques (e.g., propensity score matching; regression discontinuity design; instrumental variables methods) discussed in the morning. Stata statistical code and data to estimate these models will be provided by the instructor in advance of the workshop. Participants will need to bring a laptop with the Stata statistical software, the data, and the Stata code all loaded on it. Instructions on how to obtain a copy of the Stata software and code, and the data we will use, will be provided prior to the workshop.

Pre-Conference Cost: \$100 / \$50 for Graduate Students

Plenary talk: "Improving the Rigor of Education Research"

For many years Professor DesJardins has been at the forefront of applying rigorous quantitative methods to the study of IR and education-related issues. In this talk he will 1) provide a brief description of how he became engaged in applying new methods to education research; 2) provide some rationale for why we need to continue to improve the rigor of the methods we apply; 3) discuss what has, and has not worked in moving this agenda forward, and 4) will look ahead to how these methods may help improve policy and practice in postsecondary education.

Seeking Graduate Students!!!

Currently, graduate students comprise less than 1% of the AIRUM membership. They are the future of the association and will eventually serve as its leaders. In recognition of that future, AIRUM is actively seeking to recruit more graduate student involvement in the association and annual conference. Continuing with last year's change, the price of registration for graduate students will be \$100, a \$85 discount on conference registration. In addition, graduate students are eligible to apply for the AIRUM scholarship for \$100 to cover the registration fee for attending the annual conference in November. 2013 AIRUM Conference Scholarships

The AIRUM Steering Committee is again pleased to announce that three AIRUM Conference Scholarships are available for awards of \$185 each. These scholarships are intended to cover the registration fee (but not membership) for attending the AIRUM Conference in Bloomington, Minnesota on November 7th and 8th, 2013. The goal of the scholarships is to assist individuals whose work pertains to institutional research but who have been unable to attend an AIRUM Conference due to lack of institutional support for conference expenses.

Eligibility — to be considered you must meet all three of the following requirements:

- * Be involved in work related to institutional research
- Never have attended an AIRUM conference
- * Demonstrate that it is unlikely that your institution could provide you with the economic resources necessary to attend.

Application — a short (one page maximum) essay with the following items sent to the address below (either via U.S. Mail or by email), postmarked no later than October 4, 2013.

- * A brief description of your current duties
- An explanation of why you want to attend the conference
- * A short description of financial need

Award — each of the three scholarships covers the base conference registration fee of \$185. (\$100 for Graduate Students)

Selection Process — all applications postmarked no later than October 4 will be reviewed by the AIRUM Steering Committee. Applicants will be notified of the Steering Committee's decision shortly afterwards. If you have already registered and paid for the conference, your registration fee will be refunded if you are selected.


